ERIK: Early Identification and Referrals and Sharing Sensitive News

Date: February 22nd 2011

You will learn how to make referrals to York Region Preschool Speech and Language Program and Early Intervention Services. You will also learn how to share this news in a sensitive manner

Teacher Talk™ A: Encouraging Language Development in Early Childhood Settings (2 Sessions) - You must attend BOTH sessions

Dates: March 1st and 8th 2011

Early Childhood Educators will be taught how use play and daily routines to create enriched, interactive language learning environments to meet the communication needs of all children including those with language delays and second language learners. Participants will learn to identify children's conversational styles and the roles teachers play in order to understand how these affect the child's ability and willingness to communicate. They will learn specific strategies to help children become better conversational partners in individual and group interactions.

After Teacher Talk A you may attend the following 2 courses:

Teacher Talk™ B: Let Language Lead the Way to Literacy (2 Sessions) - You must attend BOTH sessions

Dates: March 15th and 22nd 2011

Early Childhood Educators have a crucial role to play in laying the foundations for the development of reading and writing skills, preparing children for school. Research has shown that high-quality, developmentally attuned interactions between teachers and children are associated with later literacy success. This workshop discusses the important links between oral language development and literacy, providing practical strategies to pave the way to literacy. Strategies are aimed at helping children develop positive attitudes towards the use of print, choosing books matched to interest and developmental stage, making print a natural and meaningful part of each day and using reading as a time for interaction and conversation.

Teacher Talk™ C: Fostering Peer Interaction in Early Childhood Settings (2 Sessions) - You must attend BOTH sessions

Dates: March 29th and April 5th 2011

Playing with peers is not only a magical part of childhood, but provides limitless possibilities for children to learn from each other, impacting enormously on social and language development. Children with poor language and social skills often have difficulty initiating and maintaining interactions with their peers, and may be left out and socially isolated. This workshop will teach ways of fostering a physical and social environment that encourages many opportunities for successful peer interactions. Teachers will learn how to make the most effective use of space in the classroom, how to use a variety of groups to enhance interaction, and what materials and activities promote interaction. ECEs will learn ways to support children's conversations with peers by directing conversations away from adults, creating reasons for interaction and providing specific coaching to the children.

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Stuttering: What you can do to support the child who stutters in your classroom

Date: April 12th 2011

Stuttering is one of the most complex and interesting communication disorders, which might worsen over time if not treated early. This interactive workshop will provide background information on stuttering, videos and hands on experiences and practice which will help participants support children who stutter in their child care setting.

Cracking the Language Code

2 Parts: You must attend BOTH sessions

Dates: April 26th and May 10th 2011

This 2 part course is especially designed to assist teachers understand how children learn to talk. Learn how children learn to translate concepts into words (content), develop grammar (form) and use language for many purposes. These talks will help you understand the ages and stages of language development and why language enrichment in the classroom is so important. You will learn strategies to support children in your classroom.

“HELP! I don’t know what he is saying”...

Date: May 17th 2011

This course will help teachers to support children whose speech is difficult to understand. Learn the ages and stages of articulation development and how to decode speech you don’t understand! You will learn how to work out what these children say and what to do to support them in the classroom.
